WHERE IS THE GLASS CEILING NOW?

On the 18th, in 1920, the 19th Amendment is Ratified, granting women the right to vote. The Glass ceiling seems to be breaking as women benefit from passage of the 19th Amendment. Earlier States introduced this practice as Wyoming passed the right as a Territory in 1869 with Utah following in granting the right in 1870 as a Territory, revoked by Congress in 1887 and restored again in 1895 by the State.

Ten years later the first woman to sit on the Supreme Court would be born. September 25, 1981, Sandra Day O'Connor makes history as she becomes the first woman to serve as an associate justice of the U.S. Supreme Court. To date, a total of 6 women have served on the Court, can you name them all?
