THE CESSATION OF CONFLICT

On the 3rd in 1783, **The Revolutionary War** officially ends with the signing of the Treaty of Paris. Ben Franklin, John Hartley, John Jay & John Adams, finalize an agreement with King George III to end the conflict known as the Revolutionary War.



Actually, when referring to the Treaty of Paris, it is not uncommon to mismatch this term with the cessation of other conflicts: i.e. in **1951** the European Coal and Steel Community is created, six times in the time span from **1229** to **1355**, ten times between **1515** and **1796**, fifteen times from **1801** to **1898** and nineteen times from **1900** to **2015**. By 2015, it may not be the Treaty of Paris, but the climate is being weaponized as the **Paris Climate Change Agreement** comes into reality.
