“IN GOD WE TRUST”

On the 22nd in 1864, “In God We Trust” is written onto all newly minted US Coins by an Act of Congress. By 1956, the President, approved a Joint Resolution with Congress to declare “IN GOD WE TRUST” as the national motto of the United States. If you collect coins, you will already know that there have been occasions wherein the mint did not include “In God We Trust” on the coinage minted. See if you can find which ones.
